



## **Wabash National Corporation Conflict Minerals Policy Statement**

Wabash National Corporation and its subsidiaries (“Wabash National”) are committed to supporting the aims and objectives of Section 1502 of the Dodd-Frank Act, which seeks to prevent the use of minerals - including gold, tin, tantalum and tungsten - that directly or indirectly finance or benefit armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (“DRC”) or in neighboring countries (“Conflict Minerals”). We support this legislation to further the humanitarian goal of ending violent conflict in the DRC and surrounding countries (the “Conflict Region”), which has been partially financed by exploitation and trade in these Conflict Minerals.

As part of this commitment, Wabash National will not knowingly procure Conflict Minerals – meaning those specified minerals that originate from the Conflict Region and are not certified as being “conflict free.”

In addition, since Wabash National also desires to engage in business with companies that share the values set forth in our Code of Business Conduct and Ethics, including those of integrity and the respect for human rights, we will continue to ask our suppliers to undertake reasonable due diligence to in their own supply chains to demonstrate that they source these Conflict Minerals from outside the Conflict Region and/or can certify that Conflict Minerals sourced from within the Conflict Region are “conflict free.” Through ongoing supplier engagement, data gathering, data consolidation and the utilization of auditable process documentation, we will continue to work with our supply base to verify the origin of any Conflict Minerals they may be sourcing, and to inform those suppliers we identify as sourcing “non-conflict free” Conflict Minerals of their need, within a reasonable time frame, to move towards using conflict free sources for materials or components containing Conflict Minerals, depending on the criticality of the specific component or material and the availability of alternative suppliers. Given the size, breadth and complexity of our products and supply chain, we anticipate it will take time for many of our suppliers to verify the origin of their Conflict Minerals and, if applicable, to identify alternative “conflict free” sources for these materials. Nevertheless, we are committed to working with our supply chain to satisfy the aims and goals of legislation aimed at ending violence in the Conflict Region.
